Program:

They can be made from left over blocks, orphan blocks, gift blocks, left over project blocks from workshops, and even loose blocks from estate sales. The sources are endless.

Kim pointed out that it is a great idea to come up with a theme and let others know. Tell them that if they have any blocks or pieces that fall into the category, they are welcome to donate to your kitchen sink quilt.

Leaders and Enders that do not have a specified quilt are also very beneficial to a kitchen sink quilt. Using skinny strips for a log cabin type block is another example of a leader and ender.

Possible themes for example: Colors – yellow quilt, red quilt, etc.... Animal quilt – cow quilt... Holiday quilt – Christmas quilt... Utility quilt, vintage quilt, “all things pointy”

The possibilities are infinite!

Kim showcased many kitchen sink quilts using some of the examples above.

Other quilts she mentioned were the crumb quilt and the crazy mom quilt.
